ii. MARKS OBTAINED BY 1ST YEAR STUDENTS IN HS EXAMINATION:

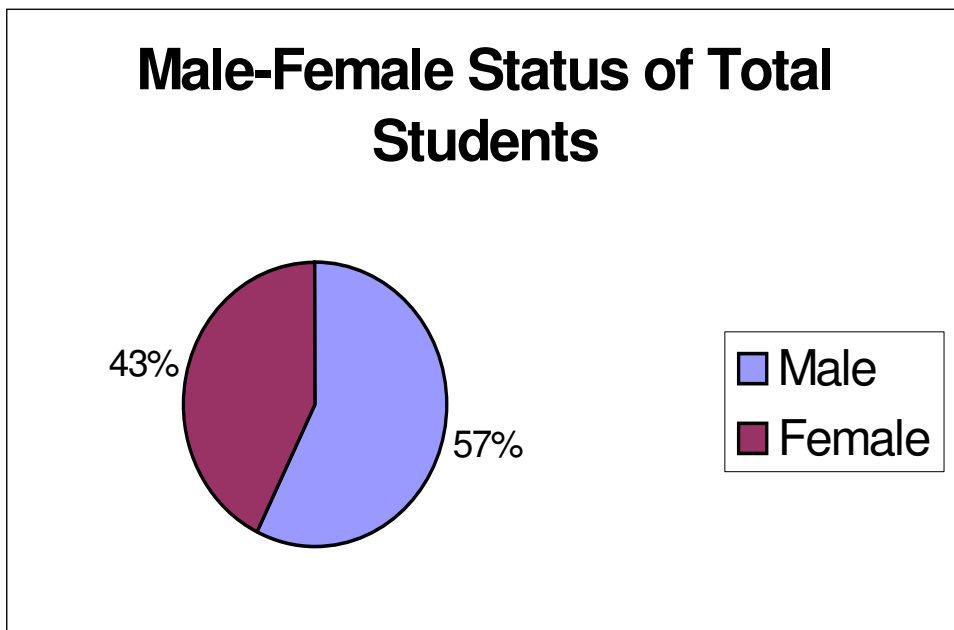

7. LIBRARY FACILITIES:

The College Library is situated in the 3rd Floor of the old building with a beautiful overview of the Hooghly river and Dakshineswar Temple. This Library was established in the year 1927 and has a rare book section of invaluable books.

The total number of books in the Library is 19,009 and every year there is a fresh purchase of books from the UGC grants. The Library remains open on all days except on holidays and Sundays. There is a duly constituted Library Committee.

The manual cataloguing of the books is nearly complete. The library catalogue is being wholly computerized. This monumental work is progressing satisfactorily and is expected to be completed by next year. The library infrastructure has also been revamped with more organised racks, proper seating arrangements and improved toilet/drinking water facilities. Each department is upgrading their seminar library with addition of new books and journals.

8. LABORATORY FACILITIES:

Adequate space is available for the purpose of the laboratories. The condition of the instruments is also fine although with technological progress some of them need to be updated. There is a small Gas plant for supply of gas for practical classes in the Chemistry Laboratory, Physics Laboratory and Physiology Laboratory. There is a provision for laminar flow in Botany laboratory. The Zoology Laboratory is well equipped

for Zoology Honours students with some rare species. The Computer Science Laboratory has five computers at their disposal, with latest configuration and software programmes.

9. INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES:

i. BUILDING: As per Peer team suggestion, vertical expansion has been done with the addition of 3rd floor to the existing structure. The aging building has also been given a through makeover to withstand the expansion. The following improvement has been accomplished in the 2005-2006 Academic year.

- a. The outlay of funds for this transformation is 25 lakhs.
- b. Increase of 7,400 sq. m. of space is achieved which resulted in 7 new classrooms capable of accommodating 720 students.
- c. Each classroom is equipped with high and low benches, new blackboard and a audio system to facilitate teaching is also on the anvil.
- d. Painting of the college is finished giving it a spank new look.
- e. Two small gardens are being developed at the front and back of the college.
- f. Expansion of certain departments is in process like Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physiology, Mathematics, Economics and Commerce. Special care has been taken to ensure upgradation of laboratory and seminar library of these respective departments.
- g. Library roof renovation was done at the total cost of 1.25 lakhs to preserve rare books.
- h. Grills are installed in windows and balconies of the college to ensure safety of the students.
- i. A Maintenance Committee is setup to look after the overall infrastructural maintenance of the college.
- j. Future plans are afoot to increase the infrastructural capacity of the college. For this reason, 15 lakhs are applied from MP lad funds to upgrade the Physics department. Building funds are also being applied from UGC to upgrade the Ladies Common Room, to renovate the roof of the Physiology department and to construct a Ladies Hostel.

ii. PLAYGROUND: Presently there is no playground in the campus of the college as there is an acute crisis of space.

iii. **GYMNASIUM:** Presently there is no facility for a gymnasium.

iv. **COMMON ROOMS:** There are two separate common rooms for boys and girls with indoor games facilities.

v. **COLLEGE AUDITORIUM:** The ground floor of the old building has an Auditorium named "Centenary Hall". This hall can accommodate 320 people with a stage appropriate for performance of Drama, concerts etc. The hall, unique of its kind in the locality, not only helps the authorities to organize seminars, counselling sessions, college functions etc., but is also a centre for cultural and business oriented programmes for different organizations. The hall is also let out to business organizations which help in generation of funds. In this aspect we would like to emphasize the maximum utilization of infrastructural facilities and role of the institution in the socio-cultural upliftment of the surrounding area.

vi. **GOVERNANCE:** In the last 3 years, 16 meetings of the Governing Body were held. The break-up is given below:

v. **ANNUAL COLLECTION FROM STUDENTS:**

Collection from Self-financing courses: [Rs. 3000 x 23 = Rs. 69,000 + Rs. 200 x 358 = Rs. 71,600] Thus the total collected sum is Rs 1,40,600.

11. TEACHING FACILITIES:

- i. **ATTENDANCE REGISTER OF TEACHERS:** Maintained and monitored regularly.
- ii. **COLLEGE EXAMINATION:** Internal college examinations like Half-yearly, Annual and Test examination regularly take place under the watchful eyes of the Examination Committee. Departmental Examinations which include Class tests, Unit tests of Honours & General courses are taken by the respective departments.
- iii. **WHETHER SYLLABUS IS COMPLETELY COVERED:** Yes, the syllabus is completely covered. Feedback regarding this matter is taken directly from the students.
- iv. **REMEDIAL COACHING:** Remedial coaching classes for the students constantly take place in respective departments. Teachers also remain available for consultation with the students outside normal class hours.

12. STUDENTS' AFFAIRS:

- i. **ATTENDANCE AND DISCIPLINE:** Both these aspects are given top priority in the college.
- ii. **GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL MECHANISM:** A formal cell is being formed. The shape of the cell is already in place which is given below:

CONSTITUTION OF THE GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL OF RAJA PEARY MOHAN COLLEGE

1. NAME: The Name of the Cell shall be: **GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL OF RAJA PEARY MOHAN COLLEGE, UTTARPARA, HOOGHLY**
2. OFFICE: The CELL will be located in the Principal's Office of Raja Peary Mohan College, Uttarpara, Hooghly
3. OBJECT: The object of the CELL will be -
 - to receive and record all the grievances that may be brought to the notice of the college;
 - to attend to the Grievances that are brought to the notice of the College by any person including students, parents, non-teaching staff and the teaching staff and hold inquiries to ascertain facts in relation to the grievances with a view to redress expeditiously the same;

- to make recommendations to the Principal and/or the Governing Body of the college which would help in redressing the grievances and also to ensure that there is no cause for making grievance in the future.

4. COMPOSITION & METHODS OF FORMATION: The Grievance CELL shall consist of the Principal and other five members nominated by the Governing Body of the College from amongst the teaching and non-teaching staff of the college, for a period of two years from the date of constitution of the CELL. The Principal shall be the Chair-person of the said CELL. The Composition will be as follows:

1. Principal, Chairperson (Ex-officio).
2. President, Students' Union (Convenor).
3. Secretary, Teachers' Council.
4. Secretary, Non-teaching Employees Union.
5. Teacher Representative.
6. Non-teaching Representative.

5. PROCEDURE FOR FILING OF GRIEVANCES AND ENQUIRY: Any person being a student, parent of student, non-teaching staff may lodge the Grievance in writing in the prescribed form to the Principal of the College, setting out the grievance clearly and giving particulars that will help in identification of the cause of the said grievance. Joint grievance may also be submitted by groups of students, parents, non-teaching staff or teaching staff. The grievance may be in relation to the working of the college including infrastructure, admission, academic, examinations, co-curricular, extra-curricular, discipline and so on.

All filled in grievance forms / letters are to be deposited in the Grievance Redressal Box. On receipt of a grievance, the Principal shall, if satisfied that the grievance needs to be inquired into, forward the same to the Chair-person of the Grievance Cell for placing before the CELL and for such action as the CELL may deem necessary to redress the grievance. The Grievance Cell shall have the power to call any person whom the CELL considers necessary to examine. The Grievance Cell may adopt suitable procedure in each case depending on the nature of the case, to inquire into facts and circumstances with a view to identify the cause of the grievance. The CELL shall thereafter make suitable recommendations to the Principal.

The Principal shall act as the appellate authority in relation to the recommendations of the CELL except in cases where the grievance relates to the Principal directly or indirectly. No member of the CELL will act as member of the Grievance CELL where the Grievance relates to such member directly or indirectly.

The CELL shall ask to attend to each Grievance within the shortest period of time and in any case give its recommendations within a period of one month from the date on which the Grievance was referred to it by the Principal. In case, for any reason, the grievance could not be resolved within the time period of one month, the Committee shall give reasons for the delay and seek additional time for resolving the grievance. The decision taken by the Grievance Redressal Cell shall be ratified by the Governing Body before taking any final decision.

The Grievance CELL shall not mentioned any grievance if it relates to a complaint of sexual harassment for which separate Women's Development Cell is to be constituted as per the Hon'ble Supreme Court directive and University directions.

6. RECORD OF GRIEVANCES: All grievances received by the CELL shall be recorded in the Register of Grievances with particulars such as date of grievance, date on which it was received by the CELL, name/s of the person submitting the grievance, person examined, action initiated and recommendations made.

7. SITTINGS OF THE GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL: The Grievance CELL shall meet as often as may be necessary depending on the number of cases of grievances registered with the Cell. The quorum for the Grievance Cell shall be 4 members who shall include the Chair-person of the Cell.

iii. ACTIVITIES OF THE STUDENT UNION:

The Student Union is an active and constructive body in the college managed democratically by the students themselves. They organize a bevy of activities, a summary of which is given below:

- d. **Jhuma Dutta** and **Sandip Das** got First prize in Inter-College Quiz competition held at Hooghly Women's College, West Bengal on 19th Sept, 2006.
- e. **Subhajit Chatterjee** got First prize in Inter-College Solo Dance Competition held at Hooghly Women's College, West Bengal on 19th September 2006.
- f. **Rudrani Chandra** got First prize in all categories of Inter-College Singing (Rabindrasangeet, Nazrulgeeti and Adhunik) Competition held at Hooghly Women's College, West Bengal on 19th September 2006.

iv. MUSIC AND PERFORMING ARTS CELL

The college is in the process of seeking permission to set up a music and performing arts cell as per NAAC Peer Team recommendation. The cell is in process of negotiating with Rabindra Bharati University so that it can start certificate courses. Presently, the cell will begin its journey by participating in the weeklong cultural programme to commemorate the Sesquicentennial celebration of Calcutta University in the 2nd half of January, 2007.

13. OUTREACH ACTIVITIES:

i. COLLEGE PUBLICATIONS:

- a) The visually attractive **College Bulletin** came out at the end of the year 2005 documenting many known and unknown facets of this heritage college.
- b) **Academic calendar** for the year 2005-2006 specifying the distribution of syllabus and number of classes allotted for the completion of the same.
- c) **Staff and Student diaries** for the year 2005-2006 are distributed.
- d) The Second issue (Vol.2 No.1) of the **Journal of Department of English, "Perspectives"** came out in the year 2006. The journal is a full-fledged **international issue** with contributions from international and national experts. It is virtually a collector's edition concentrating on the subject: "*Literatures in English*"
- e) The First issue of the **Journal of Department of Commerce** came out in the year 2005 containing invaluable articles written by experts of respective fields.
- f) The First issue of the **Journal of the Department of Physiology** is in the process of completion and is expected to be formally published soon.

ii. INTER-DISCIPLINARY PROGRAMMES:

Teachers' Council regularly organises interactive sessions among teachers of various departments in the college, formally called "**Pathachakra**" ("**Study Circle**"), to encourage the inter-disciplinary approach. The sessions are also formally published in the magazine "Charcha" so that the valuable inputs are not lost in the vagaries of time. During the 2005-2006 year the following sessions are held which in turn are compiled in the 2nd volume of "Charcha"

- a. *On Terrorism* – a discussion by **Dr. Gopinath Dutta**, Head of the Department, Political Science, on 01.10.05.
- b. *Manush Na-Manush: A Concourse of Traditions* by **Dr. Debashis Chattopadhyay**, Head of the Department, English, on 19.11.05.
- c. *No Water no future* – a discussion by **Dr. Arnab Dey**, Senior Lecturer, Department of Chemistry, on 14.12.2005.

iii. SOCIAL/COMMUNITY SERVICES:

The college boasts of excellent track record with respect to social services.

a. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

Governing Body of Raja Peary Mohan College resolved to open a NSS unit in this college on 12.10.2004. Accordingly, two units of NSS were proposed to be opened and necessary action was taken for getting the University affiliation. On 04.05.2005, we got the approval from Calcutta University. An advisory committee has been formed with the Principal, Dr. Milan Kumar Pal as the chairman and Dr Anindita Mandal (Majee) as the convenor. There are 200 student members who form the backbone of the activities undertaken in the nearby slum areas recently.

b. ACHARYA PRAFULLA CHANDRA ROY ECO CLUB

Raja Peary Mohan College Eco Club was established in a joint collaboration with “Pachim Banga Bigyan Mancha”, a body actively engaged in enhancing scientific awareness throughout the state. In fact it is the only organisation of its kind in an undergraduate college in West Bengal. The A.P.C Roy Eco Club have completed one year on September 2005. Accordingly the 1st conference was held on 13.09.05 at the Centenary Hall in the college premises. A seminar lecture was arranged to mark the occasion. Dr. Bhabani Shankar Joarder, Secretary, *Pachim Banga Vigyan Mancha* Hooghly District committee delivered a lecture on contemporary environmental issues to increase the environmental awareness of the students. Another unique seminar was organised to commemorate the centenary year of Physics (2005) on 13.01.06 at the Centenary Hall. Mr. Sushanta Bagchi, Ex-Head and Lecturer of the Department of Physics, Raja Peary Mohan College and Dr. Anshutosh Khan, Reader in Physics, Ashutosh College delivered lectures on Theory of Relativity and its implications. The students of different schools also joined in this seminar. The wall magazine of the A.P.C Eco Club, *Sabujava Ritubarnamala* (a phrase borrowed from Rabindranath Tagore meaning the “greenish hue of different seasons”) is being published 4 times a year. The club has a grand plan to make a Biodiversity Register of a particular village compiled by the students of the college.

c. SOCIO-ECONOMIC SURVEY

i) Department of Economics has conducted a socio-economic survey on Self-Help Groups (SHGs) of Microfinance in Hooghly district (Tarakeswar block) of West Bengal.

Fifty-five women were surveyed by the students of the Department of Economics under the aegis of Dr. Jyotish Prakash Basu on 18.10.2006.

ii) Another comprehensive survey has been undertaken by the Department in Singur block of Hooghly District, West Bengal on SHGs of Microfinance in the month of September 2006.

iii) Department of Economics under the able guidance of Dr. Jyotish Prakash Basu conducted a survey on Self-Help Groups (SHGs) of Microfinance in Hooghly district (Mogra block) of West Bengal on September 2006.

d. SERVICE LEARNING THROUGH BLOOD DONATION

The Students Union of Raja Peary Mohan College organized a Blood Donation Camp on 16.09.2006 in collaboration with Central Blood Bank, Manicktala, Kolkata. The College has collected 60 donors. The blood is stored and transported under optimum condition with the help of Central Blood Bank workers and Students of the College. Transfusion was always under the supervision of trained personnel. Under the policy, blood transfusion is available to people irrespective of their economic or social status.

e. TOTAL LITERACY DRIVE

The Department of Bengali, Raja Peary Mohan College regularly visits the primary schools in the slums area of Uttarpara, Hooghly and teaches the socio-economically backward students of the school. The resource for this is generated by the teachers and department of Bengali. The literacy drive has made possible to improve the performance of the students and also promote volunteerism and community work in the field of education and child empowerment.
