








IV. MALE FEMALE RATIO:

6. LIBRARY FACILITIES:

The College Library is situated in the 3rd Floor of the old building with a beautiful overview of the Hooghly river and Dakshineswar Temple. This Library was established in the year 1927 and has a rare book section of invaluable books.

The total number of books in the Library is 19,009 and every year there is a fresh purchase of books from the UGC grants. The Library remains open on all days except on holidays and Sundays. There is a duly constituted Library Committee.

The manual cataloguing of the books is nearly complete. The library catalogue is being wholly computerized. This monumental work is progressing satisfactorily and is expected to be completed by next year. The library infrastructure has also been revamped with more organised racks, proper seating arrangements and improved toilet/drinking water facilities. Each department is upgrading their seminar library with addition of new books and journals.

 - The library catalogue is being wholly computerized. The library infrastructure will be revamped with more organized racks, proper seating arrangements, and computer facilities for students and improved toilet/drinking water facilities. Each department is upgrading their seminar library with addition of new books and journals.
 - ➤ Computers for students for browsing and access to the stock of books in the Main Library through LAN and Customize software are projects, which are in the pipeline. Internet facilities will also be made available to them after installation of LAN.
 - The authority will arrange training for the office and Library staff after installation of LAN to enable them to learn the handling of customizes software.
 - A Carrier Corner is created in the main Library to keep books regarding, general knowledge, carrier guidance and entrance examination for different job in December 2006. About 70 books regarding this are kept here which are all of latest edition. The costs of these books are approx. Rs 5000.00.

7. LABORATORY FACILITIES:

Adequate space is available for the purpose of the laboratories. The condition of the instruments is also fine although with technological progress some of them need to be updated. There is a

small Gas plant for supply of gas for practical classes in the Chemistry Laboratory, Physics Laboratory and Physiology Laboratory. There is a provision for laminar flow in Botany laboratory. The Zoology Laboratory is well equipped for Zoology Honours students with some rare species. The Computer Science Laboratory has Twelve computers at their disposal, with latest configuration and software programmes.

8. INFRASTRUCTUAL FACILITIES:

- i. BUILDING: a) Expansion of certain department of Zoology, Mathematics and Chemistry.
- b) A Maintenance Committee is setup to look after the overall infrastructure maintenance of the college.
- c) 4.5 lakhs have been sanctioned from MP lad funds to upgrade the Physics department. Building funds are also being applied from UGC to upgrade the Ladies Common Room, to renovate the roof of the Physiology department, Library and to renovate the old building of the college.
- d) New area and furnished room for NSOU Unit of the college.
- e) New classroom allotted for theoretical classes for Job Courses.
- ii. PLAYGROUND: Presently there is no playground in the campus of the college as there is an acute crisis of space.
- iii. GYMNASIUM: Presently there is no facility for a gymnasium.
- iv. COMMON ROOMS: There are two separate common rooms for boys and girls with indoor games facilities.
- v. COLLEGE AUDITORIUM: The ground floor of the old building has an Auditorium named "Centenary Hall". This hall can accommodate 320 people with a stage appropriate for performance of Drama, concerts etc. The hall, unique of its kind in the locality, not only helps the authorities to organize seminars, counselling sessions, college functions etc., but is also a centre for cultural and business oriented programmes for different organizations. The hall is also let out to business organizations which help in generation of funds. In this aspect we would like to emphasize the maximum utilization of infrastructural facilities and role of the institution in the socio-cultural upliftment of the surrounding area.

- iv. REMEDIAL COACHING: Remedial coaching classes for the students constantly take place in respective departments. Teachers also remain available for consultation with the students outside normal class hours.

iii. SOCIAL/COMMUNITY SERVICES:

The college boasts of excellent track record with respect to social services.

a) NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

Governing Body of Raja Peary Mohan College resolved to open a NSS unit in this college on 12.10.2004. Accordingly, two units of NSS were proposed to be opened and got the University affiliation in 2007, we got the approval from Calcutta University. An advisory committee has been formed with the Principal, Dr. Milan Kumar Pal as the chairman and Dr Hrishita Gupta Bakshi as the convenor. There are 200 student members who form the backbone of the activities undertaken in the nearby slum areas recently.

b) ACHARYA PRAFULLA CHANDRA ROY ECO CLUB

Raja Peary Mohan College Eco Club was established in a joint collaboration with "Pachim Banga Bigyan Mancha", a body actively engaged in enhancing scientific awareness throughout the state. In fact it is the only organisation of its kind in an undergraduate college in West Bengal. The A.P.C Roy Eco Club has completed three years on September 2007. Banga Vigyan Mancha Hooghly District committee delivered a lecture on contemporary environmental issues to increase the environmental awareness of the students. The wall magazine of the A.P.C Eco Club, Sabnjava Ritubarnamala (a phrase borrowed from Rabindranath Tagore meaning the "greenish hue of different seasons") is being published 4 times a year. The club organized an awareness campaign on the effects of global warming by a documentary film show of the effects of global warming in Antarctica in February 2007 The club has a grand plan to make a Biodiversity Register of a particular village compiled by the students of the college.

The blood is stored and transported under optimum condition with the help of Central Blood Bank workers and Students of the College. Transfusion was always under the supervision of trained personnel. Under the policy, blood transfusion is available to people irrespective of their economic or social status.

e. TOTAL LITERACY DRIVE

The Department of Bengali, Raja Peary Mohan College regularly visits the primary schools in the slums area of Uttarpara, Hooghly and teaches the socio-economically backward students of the school. The resource for this is generated by the teachers and department of Bengali. The literacy drive has made possible to improve the performance of the students and also promote volunteerism and community work in the field of education and child empowerment.

f. FINANCIAL AID TO STUDENTS

- a)The college financially help needy students and wave their students fees. or give 50% concession for their students fees.
- b) Regular travel concessions are awarded to each and every student of the college.
- c) Tatyana Sedina Saha Memorial Endowment scholarships amounting to Rs. 5000 each year are awarded to the best Chemistry students of different years and the best student among other science subjects.
- d) Bandana Chatterjee Memorial Endowment Scholarship amounting to Rs. 1000 per year is awarded to the best Physics Honours student based on Part II results.
- e) The teachers of the college financially helped a needy medical student named by Shantanu...... of National Medical College, Kolkata to buy books and instruments for his study.
